When should I expect my first prenatal visit?

Most providers schedule your first prenatal visit between eight and 12 weeks. This is because your baby's heartbeat cannot be heard until that time of your pregnancy. Even then, your doctor may need to do an ultrasound to see the heartbeat. Waiting until the eight- to 12-week window allows both you and your doctor or midwife to discover more about your pregnancy at your first appointment.

What happens at my first prenatal visit?

At your first prenatal visit, you will have a physical exam and be asked about your health and family medical history. You will have lab work done and receive more information about your pregnancy. You will learn how your office visits will be scheduled and what to expect as you go through your pregnancy.
